



#### **REFERRALS:**

Nine referrals were received in March. Seven of those were received after March 24<sup>th</sup> and documentation/home visits are needed to complete the requests. They will be presented at the May Board meeting.

#### **UPDATES & REQUESTS:**

Eleven beneficiary updates were processed and eight were completed. Requests include transportation, assistance w/private therapist, eyeglasses, laundry, personal care/incontinence products, rent, Comcast, MSW, nutritional supplements:

**FLO**: NINE FLO record of eligibility were completed. A total of twenty-three delighted women attended two luncheons at the Wamsutta Club. A grand time was had by all! Several women called to report their winnings on the scratch tickets and the "fun of the event."

#### **Gratitude:**

On March 23, I made a home visit for completion of an annual update. Mrs. MM was babysitting her nephew's daughter, an adorable & very active 3-year-old. Mrs. MM attempted to be upbeat but her fatigue and discouragement were visible. As we chatted, she inquired about the Wamsutta luncheon that she would be attending the next day. A smile came upon her face as she spoke of how she was looking forward to the socialization with adults. The next day, I had the opportunity to sit across the table from her at the luncheon. This was my first FLO luncheon and I was most joyous to bear witness to Mrs. MM's metamorphosis! She was glowing with happiness. She engaged in conversation with other attendees about the Azores, the Don Ho travel club and senior housing options. Mrs. MM had firmly decided that "all NB housing were not suitable" for her until she heard from 3 residents of Taber Mill. She has since submitted an application! I knew intellectually the importance of the FLO program however to witness this process provided confirmation. All the attendees were absolutely beautiful and enjoyed the time spent together. Thank you for this opportunity and for having 2 luncheons so no one was left out. The beneficiaries were VERY pleased to be together after this long period of isolation.

**Addendum:** Unable to connect with a new referral, the referral source was contacted. He alerted the ARAW that the woman had died last week. (MMP/rep payee request)

#### **FY 23 Finance Committee Membership**

Current members of the FY 22 committee plan to remain with the exception of Pam McKnight. She has been a valuable member with her perspective and leadership role in Personnel but does not want to overcommit her activity. We thank her for her support of the Finance Committee.

#### FY 22 Budget Close and FY 23 Budget Preparation

The FY 22 year-end nears completion with estimated qualified spending and federal taxes due as supplied by Burke and Lamb. Favorable investment performance in the last year has increased our capital gains liability. The committee will recommend to the board that prepayment of taxes exceed the calculated estimate so as to avoid any possible underpayment that could result in a penalty. Credit, if applicable, will be applied to next year's taxes. This was similarly done last year.

No discussion on the budget for FY 23 was necessary after board approval at the March meeting. There was discussion of the need/practice of performing a formal annual accounting audit from time to time instead of relying solely on the annual financial review by our accountants. This audit needs to be voted on prior to the start of each fiscal year. A financial review was recommended and approved for FY 23 but will be revisited for FY 24.

#### **Annual Report of the Finance Committee**

The draft report was distributed and discussed. Feedback from the members will be incorporated and another draft sent out for approval before presentation to the board at the Annual Meeting. FY 23 goals will be included.

#### Meeting the New BofA Investment Strategist, Sarah Clark

Mary will work to set up a virtual meeting with Sarah Clark, the Finance Committee and the Investment Advisory Committee. Besides making introductions and providing mutual Q&A time, the BofA team would like to present their thoughts for investments in the year ahead. It will be extremely beneficial to have our financial advisers at that virtual meeting. Acceptable dates are being collected.

#### **Possible Alternative Office Space**

Cathy shared that the office space rental at 899 Pleasant St is no longer an option. After many months, weeks and hours of trying to set up a satisfactory start to the discussion process, there were too many complicating and unanswered issues to keep this location viable. She will continue her steadfast search throughout the city with our appreciation.

The Finance Committee has completed FY 22 and now begins a new year of challenges. We'll miss Pam but thank her for her contributions. Thank you all.

Next meeting of the committee is April 12 at 9:30 AM. The joint meeting of Finance, IAC and BofA will be communicated once determined.

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### **Governance Committee Meeting Minutes – March 29, 2022**

Initially we discussed the need for the Member Handbook to receive a new year update. Various documents and reports need to be edited or replaced and distributed to the membership and we agreed to do that after the Annual Meeting as some documents from that meeting will be included.

As part of Member Handbook discussion, we asked Cathy Mayall for some feedback about her experience with the handbook as a new member. She was extremely helpful and had many suggestions and feedback which we will take under advisement as we go forward with enhancing our orientation process. She has great energy and vision and experience; however, her goals for community service and our mission do not dovetail. (In a conversation with Susan at a later date, she agreed that she had come to the same conclusion.)

Mary has a potential candidate that she will tell the Board about at our April meeting.

We approved the updated succession plan for Committee Chairs that Jane and Clare finalized for us. Ahead we need to create a succession plan for the Presidency.

Clare suggested, and we agreed, that after the new fiscal year gets underway it would be helpful to talk to those officers and chairs who moved into new jobs to learn about the plusses and minuses of those transitions in the event there are specific lessons to be learned and preserved for the next transition.

We discussed the level of discussion and debate at Board meetings. We agree that having committee reports in hand before each meeting should allow time and fuel for discussion. We sense that zoom meetings limit the ease of discussion and stifle things a bit. Debbie will address the Board to assure that there is full understanding of the freedom for discussion and questions as each committee chair reports.

We did agree that some of the fun and personal connection and energy is lost with zoom meetings, and we thought that planning some casual non-required post meeting lunches at the Wamsutta Club might be a good solution.

The Executive Director evaluation was completed by all Directors and Rosemary will use it as part of her annual review process.

### LEGACY COMMITTEE Meeting Minutes — March 14, 2022

Meeting held at the New Bedford Whaling Museum, Grimshaw-Gudewicz Reading Room, and Archives

One of the Legacy Committee tasks is to "ensure current materials in the Association's care are appropriately preserved to accurately represent the current activities of the ARAW."

The committee had previously decided that examining files at the NBWM library might give us guidance on what existing materials would be "important" to hold on to. Voluminous materials exist in our office or storage area.

We met at the Museum to view the contents of the **restricted files** that have been archived, but to ensure beneficiary privacy, are not available to the public.

• The meeting notes date from 1968 to 1989.

The materials include visiting notes (narratives) which give us an intimate view of the lives of our ladies. At the time, there were about fifteen board members and fifteen ladies.

• We reflected on where the ARAW is today as compared to 50 years ago.

We have many more women as beneficiaries with presently only about fifteen board members. Our endowment has grown, needs may have changed, federal programs are now available to assist some of these women, and we are a more structured organization.

• We discussed the impact of Covid on our interactions with the ladies and with each other.

We expressed a need for more social interaction with each other to share ideas and feelings about our shared mission. Rosemary suggested that we make that happen. Roseanne suggested we do it in "listening lunches" that were part of our organization in the past. We did not come to any decision about what materials we should keep for posterity. However, we had an engaging and motivating discussion about the Association.

- We discovered that in February of 1971, the ARAW board approved the discarding of certain materials. (Mark P. made a copy of the Minutes of the February 1<sup>st</sup> Monthly Meeting for us) It provides detail of approved materials to discard at the time. See document.

Mrs. Rodgers advised members that she and the secretary had gone through 2 cartons of material the secretary had inherited upon taking office. The Board gave permission to discard the following materials:

### **ARAW Harassment Policy**

### **HARRASSMENT**

#### **ARAW CORI POLICY**

This policy is applicable to the criminal history screening of prospective and current employees, subcontractors, vendors, volunteers and interns, professional licensing applicants, rental or leased housing applicants, and state, county, and municipal employees and applicants as those terms are defined in M.G.L. c. 268, §1.

Where Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) and other criminal history checks may be part of a general background check for employment, volunteer work, licensing purposes, or the rental or leasing of housing, the following practices and procedures will be followed.

#### I. CONDUCTING CORI SCREENING

CORI checks will only be conducted as authorized by the DCJIS and MGL c. 6, §. 172, and only after a CORI Acknowledgement Form has been completed.

A CORI acknowledgement form shall be completed on an annual basis for checks submitted for any other purpose, provided, however, that the requestor has adopted the language from the DCJIS CORI Acknowledgment Form that notifies individuals that their CORI may be requested at any time within the one year thatthe acknowledgment form is valid. If the requestor has not adopted the DCJIS CORI acknowledgment form language, then it must ensure that an acknowledgement form is competed for each and every subsequent CORI check.

### II. ACCESS TO CORI

All CORI obtained from the DCJIS is confidential, and access to the information must be limited to those individuals who have a "need to know". This may include, but not be limited to, hiring managers, staff submitting the CORI requests, and staff charged with processing job applications. The Association for the Relief of Aged Women must maintain and keep a current list of each individual authorized to have access to, or view, CORI. This list must be updated every six (6) months and is subject to inspection upon request by the DCJIS at any time.

#### III. CORI TRAINING

An informed review of a criminal record requires training. Accordingly, all personnel authorized to review or access CORI at the Association for the Relief of Aged Women will review, and will be thoroughly familiar with, the educational and relevant training materials regarding CORI laws and regulations made available by the DCJIS.

Additionally, the Association for the Relief of Aged Women is an agency required by MGL c. 6, s. 171A, to maintain a CORI Policy, all personnel authorized to conduct criminal history background checks and/or to review CORI information will review, and will be thoroughly familiar with, the CORI Policy.

### IV. USE OF CORI IN BACKGROUND SCREENING

CORI used for employment purposes shall only be accessed for applicants who are otherwise qualified for the position for which they have applied.

Unless otherwise provided by law, a criminal record will not automatically disqualify an applicant. Rather, determinations of suitability based on background checks will be made consistent with this policy and any applicable law or regulations.

### V. VERIFYING A SUBJECT'S IDENTITY

If a criminal record is received from the DCJIS, the information is to be closely compared with the information on the CORI Acknowledgment Form and any other identifying information provided by the applicant to ensure the record belongs to the applicant.

If the information in the CORI record provided does not exactly match the identification information provided by the

applicant, a determination is to be made by an individual authorized to make such determinations based on a comparison of the CORI record and documents provided by the applicant.

### VI. QUESTIONING A SUBJECT ABOUT HIS/HER CRIMINAL HISTORY

In connection with any decision regarding employment, volunteer opportunities, housing, or professional licensing, the subject shall be provided with a copy of the criminal history record, whether obtained from the DCJIS or from any other source, prior to questioning the subject about it. The source(s) of the criminal history record is also to be disclosed to the subject.

### VII. DETERMINING SUITABILITY

If a determination is made, based on the information as provided in section V of this policy, that the criminal record belongs to the subject, and the subject doesnot dispute the record's accuracy, then the determination of suitability for the position or license will be made. Unless otherwise provided by law, factors considered in determining suitability may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (a) Relevance of the record to the position sought;
- (b) The nature of the work to be performed;
- (c) Time since the conviction;
- (d) Age of the candidate at the time of the offense;
- (e) Seriousness and specific circumstances of the offense;
- (f) The number of offenses;
- (g) Whether the applicant has pending charges;
- (h) Any relevant evidence of rehabilitation or lack thereof; and
- (i) Any other relevant information, including information submitted by the candidate or requested by the organization.

The applicant is to be notified of the decision and the basis for it in a timely manner.

### VIII. ADVERSE DECISIONS BASED ON CORI

If an authorized official is inclined to make an adverse decision based on the results of a criminal history background check, the applicant will be notified in accordance with DCJIS regulations 803 CMR 2.18. The subject shall be provided with a copy of theorganization's CORI policy and a copy of the criminal history (unless a copy was provided previously). The source(s) of the criminal history will also be revealed. The subject will then be provided with an opportunity to dispute the accuracy of the CORI record. Subjects shall also be provided a copy of DCJIS' *Information Concerning the Process for Correcting a Criminal Record*.

#### IX. SECONDARY DISSEMINATION LOGS

All CORI obtained from the DCJIS is confidential and can only be disseminated as authorized by law and regulation. A central secondary dissemination log shall be used to record <u>any</u> dissemination of CORI outside this organization, including dissemination at the request of the subject.
