AGE:

Ongoing support (age 70+)
One-time assistance (age 65+)
Emergency funds (age 65+)

RESIDENCY:

Over five years in service area
Preference to women living alone

INCOME:

Monthly income under \$1,500
(with subsidized housing)
Monthly income under \$2,100
(non-subsidized housing)
Liquid assets under \$10,000
(excluding home and auto)
